



WITHDRAWAL PROCEDURES

The ReBuild NC Strategic Buyout Program is voluntary, and property owners may withdraw if they no longer wish to participate – this is called **voluntary withdrawal**. Further, property owners are required to be responsive to all program requests. If it appears that a property owner no longer wishes to participate and has become non-responsive to program requests and other communication, the withdrawal process will be initiated on the property owners' behalf – this is called **involuntary withdrawal**.

Voluntarily or involuntarily withdrawing does not prevent you from re-entering the Program while it remains open and accepting applications. If after withdrawing you would like to re-enter, call 833-ASK-RBNC (833-275-7262) or contact your Case Manager.

Voluntary Withdrawal

If you no longer wish to participate in the Program, you may withdraw at any point before conducting your closing, which occurs in Step 5. To withdraw, you must complete the Voluntary Withdrawal Request Form, available at rebuild.nc.gov. Once the completed form has been received and reviewed by program staff, you will receive a Voluntary Withdrawal Confirmation Letter confirming your withdrawal.

Involuntary Withdrawal

If you are non-responsive to requests and other communication from the Program, such as requests for documentation and/or other information that enables program staff to review and move your application forward, the Program will initiate the withdrawal process on your behalf.

If you are non-responsive, you will receive an Initial Non-responsive Letter, asking you to contact the Program within thirty (30) days to continue your participation. Over the next thirty (30) days after sending the Initial Non-responsive Letter, the Program will attempt to contact you at least four additional times.

If you do not contact the Program within the thirty-day period, you will receive an Involuntary Withdrawal Notification Letter, asking you to contact the Program within fifteen (15) days to continue your participation.

If you do not contact the Program within fifteen (15) days of the date of your Involuntary Withdrawal Notification Letter, your application will be withdrawn, and you will no longer be considered for assistance. You will receive an Involuntary Withdrawal Confirmation Letter confirming your withdrawal.
