

Developing and implementing a new stormwater utility

Funding Customers

- Local government units
- Non-profit water/wastewater companies
- For-profit/investor-owned water companies (only for the DWSRF)
- Councils of Governments that work with eligible utilities (for some programs)

Excluded:

- Individuals, businesses, homeowners
- State, federal agencies
- Non-profits that are not solely water/wastewater companies providing water/sewer service



Applications for Funding

Twice/year applications for funding (spring and fall).

Next cycle due May 1st

Stormwater (LASII) Planning

One application for all funding programs.

Applications scored based on **Priority Rating Systems** that are approved by the State Water Infrastructure Authority (SWIA).

Funding decisions made by SWIA.





Statewide Water & Wastewater Infrastructure Master Plan

The state will best be able to meet its water infrastructure needs by ensuring individual utilities are, or are on a path to be, viable systems

A viable system is one that functions as a long-term, self-sufficient business enterprise, establishes organizational excellence, and provides appropriate levels of infrastructure maintenance, operation, and reinvestment that allow the utility to provide reliable water services now and in the future



Path to Viability



Infrastructure management

- Proactive approaches
- Risk and life-cycle costs



Organizational management

- Long-term nature of system needs
- Prioritize the most critical projects



Financial management

- Operation & maintenance
- Rehabilitate or replace
- Reserve funds

INFRASTRUCTURE MANAGEMENT

Proactive approaches enable the right investments to be made in the right projects at the right time, taking into consideration life-cycle costs and risk management

ORGANIZATIONAL MANAGEMENT

Utility governing boards understand the long-term nature of water/wastewater system needs and prioritize financing completion of the most critical infrastructure projects

Viable Water & S Wastewater Utility

Systems

Sufficient revenue is generated to fund infrastructure construction, maintenance, operations and renewal/replacement without long-term reliance on grant funds

FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT

Partnerships

Resource Agency Partners for Water and Wastewater Utilities (RAPWU)

- Have well-established relationships with LGUs
- Provide technical and managerial expertise to LGUs
- Are often seen a neutral arbiters for partnerships (e.g., COGs)
- Share information and collaborate on many VUP elements
