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### The Natural Heritage Program's primary purpose is to provide assistance in establishing nature preserves.

- Conduct systematic biological surveys
- Identify Natural Heritage Program natural areas and prioritize them for conservation
- Maintain a database of natural heritage elements
- Establish Dedicated Nature Preserves (DNPs) and Registered Heritage Areas (RHAs)
- Share information to facilitate protection of NC's rarest species and their habitats







### Natural Heritage Program Datasets

**Element Occurrences**: an area of land or water where a species, high-quality natural community, or animal assemblage is or was

Managed Areas: properties and easements where natural resource conservation is one of the primary management goals or areas of open space where open space is scarce

**Natural Areas**: terrestrial and aquatic areas that are of special biodiversity significance


Biodiversity and Wildlife Habitat Assessment: conservation priorities for aquatic and terrestrial species and habitats, as well as landscape functions and connectivity



\*These are not survey grade data nor are a substitute for land or biological survey data - they are an aid to conservation planning only


### **Element Occurrences**

- Locations where an Element was observed or historically present
- Mapped feature includes locational uncertainty
- Compiled from a variety of sources
- Not publicly available



### **Managed Areas**


- Properties and easements where natural resource conservation is one of the primary management goals
- Primarily parcel or easement boundaries
- Variety of data sources
- Publicly available



### **Natural Areas**

- Terrestrial and aquatic areas that are of special biodiversity significance
- Unit of conservation concern targets of conservation action
- Boundaries are based on field observation and are ecological
- Surveyed with landowner permission only
- Contains at least one Element Occurrence
- No regulatory nexus or inherent legal protection
- Significant Natural Heritage Area is a legacy name that is no longer used
- Publicly available






### Prioritizing Natural Areas

#### Significance Ratings:

- Collective value (C-value)
  - Based on the number and imperilment of all the Elements present
  - Count of the number of Elements in the natural area weighted by their rarity
  - C1 (Exceptional) C5 (General)
- Representational value (R-value)
  - Natural areas that represent the best examples of each tracked Element in N.C.
  - R1 (Exceptional) R5 (General)

## Biodiversity and Wildlife Habitat Assessment


- Part of the N.C. Conservation Planning Tool (CPT)
- Model that identifies core wildlife habitats and connectors, and land and water resources important for ecosystem health
- Help coordinate and guide conservation efforts and inform planning decisions
- Element Occurrences and Natural Areas are among the data inputs










